

Are you having a Heart Attack? Silent Myocardial Infarction (SMI) Check these symptoms:

SMI warning signs

SMI symptoms are often mild and brief. Seek immediate medical attention if you experience one or more of the following:

- Discomfort in the center of the chest that lasts several minutes or goes away and comes back. It can feel like an uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, or pain.
- Discomfort in other upper-body areas, such as one or both arms, the back, the neck, the jaw,
- Shortness of breath before or during chest discomfort.

Breaking out in a cold sweat or feeling nauseated or lightheaded.

SMI is usually detected from an electrocardiogram (EKG) or echocardiogram, which can highlight heart muscle damage. Another method is a blood test for the molecular footprints of troponin T, a protein released by injured heart cells. That test is often used in emergency departments for patients with heart attack symptoms.

When in doubt call 911!

Monthly Meeting

<u>This Time Last Year</u> – The FAA shut down the Chula Vista field due to non-compliance with requirements to hold a Letter of Agreement (LOA) with the local control towers.

We (the Weedwackers) recently renewed our agreement with Gillespie Field ("SEE"), which is posted on the bulletin board, with a copy in the binder inside the pin box. You'll recall that our field lies within 5 nautical miles (and within 5 statute miles, as it happens) of Gillespie field. The FAA requires we enter into an LOA with their Air Traffic Manager.

Membership Renewals

You may see Scott Graupmann's name come up which is fine, as he's the treasurer holding the PayPal account open. In either case, please be sure to add either your full name or AMA number to the PayPal payment note. If we see only your PayPal login as "Im a catlover", we'll have no way of processing your dues.

County Lease - We now have a fully executed lease

agreement with the County of San Diego which goes into effect on January 1st. The lease replaces the Maintenance and Use Agreement that we've held for a couple of decades. To recap, the prior agreement was no-cost, but the County agenda was to eliminate all such agreements and use leases for uniformity. The only impact is that we now pay \$500 per year. Sucks for us, but there was no way out. This effort has actually been working for the last three years and we tried over and over to convince the County that we were just fine with the way it was. No joy. Other than that, we still get to fly!
